

Effect of Indian climate on Tourism

The climate of India defies easy generalisation, comprising a wide range of weather conditions across a large geographic scale and varied topography.

This affects the tourism industry of our country by a large margin

The interface between climate and tourism is multifaceted and complex, it also has an important influence on environmental conditions that can deter tourists, including infectious disease, wildfires, insect or water-borne pests.

Extreme events such as tropical cyclones which is quite common in states like Orisa.

All tourism destinations are climate-sensitive to a degree, in that they are influenced by natural seasonality in demand, are affected positively or negatively by interannual climate variability

For example, the heatwaves in extreme weather conditions in central India

Climate variability also influences various aspects of tourism operations

For example- water supply and market chains of general goods in the mountainous region discourages tourism for many

In the same way that climate affects the destination choice of travellers it highly influences the timing of travel

Seasonal demand defines the global tourism's characteristics and encourage the region's local economy to flourish

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
